

## Sports Premium Spend – Impact Report - Academic Year 2015-2016

**Government Funding £9275 in 2015//2016 of which £4000 was spent on Islington Council’s Schools’ PE and Sports Team Annual Support Package which supports PE development within the school and beyond.**
